Lesley has lived in Newhaven for 30 years having moved from Surrey when she got married. Her husband Shaun and daughter Dannii will share consort duties as and when required.

Lesley was elected to Newhaven Town Council in 2019 and previously worked with Council officers on the management of Riverside Park as the Chair of the Friends group of volunteers.

New Community Supermarket

People in Newhaven can access healthy, affordable food thanks to a new project.

SCDA recently launched a new weekly Community
Supermarket at Denton
Island Community Centre in
Newhaven for local residents.
It is open every Monday from
11am to 3pm to members and is already making a positive impact.

Community Supermarkets operate on the principle that everyone should have access to healthy, affordable food, close to home. Members can access food and essential household items and will be invited to contribute on a pay as you feel basis, based on what they can afford. The aim is to help people move beyond foodbank use, or to help reduce a family's

need for a foodbank, whilst also reducing food waste and connecting local residents.

SCDA continues to provide emergency food parcels to residents in Newhaven via Seahaven Foodbank, but the Community Supermarket allows members to make choices about the food they get and the volunteer team is able to respond directly the needs of the community, adding a much needed social element to the service.

The food and other items at Newhaven Community Supermarket are obtained from a variety of sources, including Fareshare Sussex and local businesses, helping to reduce food waste and keeping the environmental impact as low as possible.

This photo shows 'Yvonne Cup Night', at The Engineer pub in Railway Road. The cup was named after Yvonne King, daughter of the then Landlord and Landlady, Harry and Elsie King, and was awarded to the winners of a darts competition. Yvonne is second from the left in the front row, with her parents next to her. One very notable face in the back row, third from the left, is Captain Fred Holden, Master of three Newhaven tugs – Foremost 22, Tidworth and Meeching – from before the Secord World War until his retirement in 1963.

We were told in 2010 that the cup was still on display at The Engineer and that the photo is from the late 1940s or early 1950s.



LYT Productions and the team of artists working on the Tide Mills Project have been getting to know the local community, while preparing to bring Tide Mills back to life at their special Heritage Celebratory Week, 20 – 26 September.

This has included working with a team of volunteers from Priory Community Garden, The Exchange Project Seaford, Seaford Environmental Alliance and Sussex Community Development Association to create an allotment featuring vegetables that would have been eaten when Tide Mills was in its heyday. Scenic artist Romy Loughman and illustrator Rachel Cunningham are working on a stage set based on the Stationmaster's Cottage at Tide Mills with the N.I.P.P.E.R.S. Community Group; and hundreds of school children and local residents have created circle weavings during lockdown, from online instructions created by fibre artist Kittie Kipper. These circles will be woven by Kittie into a major installation, to be completed on site during the celebratory week in September. Artists Ellie Johnson-Bullock and Sam Ford have been running after school art clubs considering some of the historical issues surrounding the site - and especially the relevance of pineapples! There are still opportunities to get involved - do get in touch via the Tide Mills Project website.

As well as the fascinating art and multimedia installations which will be on view in September, there will also be a range of workshops, talks – and some very special musical performances. Artists confirmed include local musicians Colin Chapman, Nigel Goss and The Kites. The legendary Copper Family will be performing, as well as a very special event with Mercury Music Prize nominee, Sam Lee, which will close the event. 

Newhaven Young Creatives Launched

An exciting opportunity for Newhaven's young people to develop their performing arts skills will be launched this summer by Creative Force. This East Sussex based arts and training organisation has been successful in receiving funding from Arts Council England and support from an impressive range of Newhaven and East Sussex based regeneration, arts, youth and education partners.

Siou Hannam, a Director of Creative Force and a Newhaven resident, will be overseeing the project, called Safer. The fayre will be opened by local dignitaries and this year will see the return of the popular Pirelli Formula



NEWHAVEN MUSEUM GETS A MAKEOVER!

The enforced closure of the museum last year together with a very welcome grant from the Government provided the volunteers from the Newhaven Historical Society with an opportunity to revamp the museum's reception area. Gone is the old and dark furniture and fittings and they have been replaced with a much bigger, brighter and welcoming counter

and sales area. In addition, a large model of a sailing ship, The Octavia, now provides a dramatic backdrop to the museum entrance. Some of you might recall seeing this model at mounted on top of the bar in the former public house, The General Ardagh.

TORPEDO ACCIDENTLY RELEASED IN NEWHAVEN HARBOUR

25th August 1944 • Extract from 'The War in Sussex'

The mechanism from a torpedo tube on a ship (presumably from a motor torpedo boat) in Newhaven Harbour operated accidently, and the torpedo passed through the stern of a motor launch (possibly a landing craft) coming to rest on the river bed without exploding.

Under the direction of the Divisional Marine Manager Mr R.J. Cady, a local diver, Mr. Thomas Knight of 18 Railway Road was hurriedly called from the Newhaven cinema and, on arrival at the harbour, lowered into the muddy water. Knee deep in mud, he searched for the torpedo, aware that it could explode at any time. Although visibility was restricted, he located the torpedo and returned to the surface to report his findings. Having made his report Mr Knight returned to the torpedo and attached slings to it. Slings attached he gave the signal for the torpedo to be raised to the surface. Mr Knight was awarded the B.E.M. for his actions.

For his bravery, the crane driver Mr H Gough of 3 Eastbridge Road in hauling the torpedo on to the dock was recognised with the award of a parchment and £2 by the Southern Railway Company.

For laying out crane cables, handling the torpedo as it hung from the cables and setting it to rest safely on the quay Dock Checker G.F. Martin and Dock loader W.J Wilkes both of Railway Road were awarded a parchment and £2 by the Southern Railway Company.

The torpedo was then made safe.

Quote from a Motor Torpedo Boat crew member

"One boat accidently fired a torpedo in harbour. It landed on a Commando boat moored in front, going straight through and sinking it. It did not explode of course not having travelled through the water. No one was hurt.

TURNING ROAD VERGES INTO NATURE RESERVES

We live in an age where it seems development and economic gain are placed at a higher value than the natural world around us. This often means that wildlife has to fit into the spaces that are left. It is far from ideal but there are approaches which can help to sustain wildlife and also enhance the local environment for people.

One approach has been encouraged by the Greenhavens Network in Newhaven, in which gardens are allowed to grow wilder. Another is that farmers leave a few metres around fields and paths each year to grow naturally. A third is to manage the town's road verges to enhance their wildlife potential. These methods all have the potential to sustain wildlife such as pollinating insects by creating nectar-rich green corridors which link together with Newhaven's open spaces and the wider environment.

Wildflower meadows in Britain have declined by 97% in the past 75 years, yet studies have found that nearly half of Britain's wild flowers grow on verges. The charity Plantlife

with its Road Verge Campaign says that well-managed verges would become a nationwide network of flower-rich grassland covering a vast area of land. Campaigns around the country have sought to balance the decline by cultivating better plant diversity along road verges and one successful project recently celebrated its 30th anniversary.

The St. George's Flower Bank near Bristol was created when a section of A-road was diverted in 1970. The bare soil exposed during the roadworks was allowed to naturally regenerate for twenty years before a local resident began some 'guerilla' conservation work by clearing brambles from around wildlflowers. A grass-roots movement grew from this until a local Council agreed a formal workplan in 1996. The project has since evolved into a small charity, won funding to put towards its work and in 2007 the bank was declared a Local Nature Reserve. This was a remarkable achievement which challenged the conventional idea of what and where a nature reserve should be.

Mowing verges to keep grasses and other flora short results in the more vigorous grasses dominating other smaller grasses, sedges and flowers. It results in a sward made up of few species which are attractive to only a small number of insects. An alternative approach of selective cutting at the end of the growing season, when the flora have set seed, and introducing a beneficial flower called Yellow-rattle, allows a shorter and more diverse sward to develop and attracts far more insect life. The natural world is the same as the road network: everything is connected. Richer verges will attract not only insects but small mammals, reptiles, birds and networks of fungi which in turn support even more flowers such as orchids.

Managing road verges has its risks and challenges, especially considering the volume and speed of passing traffic, but the St. George's Flower Bank has proven that, with careful management and collaboration between volunteers and the local authority, the benefits outweigh any hazards and make towns more attractive for everyone.

A wilder garden doesn't need to look messy. Longer grass benefits dandelions and other lawn flowers providing essential nectar for our pollinators. Lots of caterpillars and other insects also live within longer lawns and come out at night to eat the grasses. You could just leave a 1m2 patch and see how it looks? You will be surprised how quickly it becomes a little haven for wildlife. If you are





worried what the neighbours may think you can put up a blue heart sign indicating you are 'wilding' your garden or leaving space for nature. We encourage using a mix of native plants and non-natives to maximise diversity of structure, flower shape, and the different flowering times extending length of nectar season.

Wilder Gardens Champions can create a garden to inspire their neighbours and work together to create a street of gardens that become a corridor or highway for animals to safely get around, feed, roost, sleep and hibernate. Our wildlife needs help to survive increased development and climate change. Let's be the change we want to see, the time to act is now and together we can step up for wildlife. 
Lewes District Citizens Advice

How to find a reliable builder

If you take advantage of the warmer weather to improve your home here are some steps you should take when choosing a trader:

- Find a Trading Standards 'approved trader' - use the internet to search for a local trader or the Government's approved trader scheme TrustMark: www.trustmark. org.uk.
- Get references or recommendations - ask the person for examples of work they've carried out. Avoid contractors who won't give references.
- Are they a current member of a trade body? Trade bodies have codes of practice and can help resolve problems. Ask who they're registered with and check their website.
- Only use certified traders for gas and electrics. Check the Gas Safe Register: www. gassaferegister.co.uk for a list of traders and use

- a registered electrician who can certify their own work. When you're having a kitchen fitted, check whether they will be doing the electrical or gas work themselves. If not, check whether that person is registered.
- A written quote a quote is legally binding and the builder can't change it without good reason.
- Compare quotes from several contractors to check
- A written contract covering everything you're paying for and agreed.
- Payments pay in stages not upfront. Pay by card, this affords you protection if something goes wrong.
- Keep receipts, contracts, and photos of any problems. If you have a problem with a contractor, call the Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline 0808 223 1133.


