WEST BEACH UPDATE

This autumn will see the final stage in the long running legal battle over village green status for the sandy West Beach. The owners of the beach, Newhaven Port and Properties are appealing to the Supreme Court against the decision made by the Appeal Court in March 2013 that the beach can be registered as a village green. The case is expected to start on either 3rd or 4th November – the exact date will be confirmed nearer the time.

£200k upgrade for public transport at station?

People are being offered the chance to view plans for improved public transport facilities near Newhaven Town railway station.

The East Sussex County
Council scheme is due to be
completed in time for the
opening of the new University
Technical College (UTC) on
Railway Quay in September
next year.

The facility will include improved bus stops and waiting areas and provide better links between the station, bus services and the college, enhancing the experience for passengers and encouraging more people to use public transport for everyday journeys.

The design will incorporate bus stops for east and westbound buses, a taxi rank and a pick-up and drop-off area, while a new real-time passenger information system will improve the connection between bus and rail services.


The £200,000 project is being funded by a combination of contributions from local developers and county council funds set aside for local transport improvements.

The new layout is being developed in consultation with local organisations including

bus and rail operators. Work is due to begin in March next year.

Meetings to keep you posted!

The Town Council's Neighbourhood Plan is gaining momentum with over 200 local people visiting one of the five exhibitions that were held around the town in July and August. The exhibitions gave people the opportunity to let us know where new development should go, what sort of homes there should be and what they think needs improving in the town.

In addition many people have submitted their completed questionnaires to us which had been delivered to local homes and made available at the exhibitions and on the Town Council's website.

The seven Topic Papers that formed the framework for the exhibitions and the questionnaire are still available in the local library, at the Town Council offices and on the Town Council's website at www.newhaventowncouncil.gov.uk.

EYES ALONG THE COAST

The National Coastwatch Institution (NCI) is a national charity whose work is assisting in the preservation of life along our UK shoreline and inshore waters. This is achieved by keeping watch all day, every day, from a variety of lookout stations. There are currently 50 lookout stations in the UK manned by over 2,100 highly trained volunteers.

This year, Newhaven NCI celebrated its tenth anniversary after ten years of watchkeeping from the old coastguard lookout on Castle Hill, Newhaven. Newhaven NCI has a complement of 62 watchkeepers, Assistant Watchkeepers and Trainee Watchkeepers. Newhaven NCI stands three watches a day 365 days a year. All watchkeepers are unpaid volunteers and even pay for their own uniform.

The principal tool of NCI is watchkeepers' eyes and ears. Other useful tools are high-power binoculars and telescopes, radar, weather stations and automatic identification systems for shipping. VHF radios are also monitored by each watch.

Every day of the year in all weathers, if you are using our local coastline or inshore waters, Newhaven NCI is watching over you. For further information visit www.nci.org.uk/newhaven.



Lifeboat Awards

Newhaven's lifeboat crew and fundraisers have been recognised with a number of awards for their considerable contributions to the RNLI, with Coxswain Paul Legendre receiving a 'Thanks of the Institution on Vellum', the highest award given by the RNLI for services during 2013. Paul's award was for his role in the search for 14-year-old Dylan Alkins, who was swept into the sea off Newhaven's West Beach last October.



The awards were presented by Mr Charles Hunter-Pease OBE, Chairman of the RNLI, who said "The seamanship Paul displayed during this service was second to none and the concentration required to hold the lifeboat in position in shallow waters and breaking waves was intense.

"This shows the dedication, bravery and teamwork demanded of a lifeboat crew working in extremely challenging conditions to try to save a life."

Newhaven lifeboat Operations Manager Mike Tubb was presented with a framed letter of thanks for Newhaven lifeboat station.

A one minute silence was held as a mark of respect for Dylan who has not been found.

Three volunteer fundraising awards were also presented, to Roy Fenner, the Treasurer of the Society, Peter Mercer, Vice-Chairman of the Society, and Graham and Paula Hillman, Joint Secretaries.

Newhaven's First World War

Following on from the last issue of Newhaven Matters, we continue to look at what was happening in Newhaven at the outbreak of the First World War:



October 1914

The Defence of Antwerp

About 80 men of the Newhaven companies of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve went to the aid of Belgian forces defending the forts at Antwerp. The German advance penetrated the outer ring of forts, leaving no alternative but for the troops to withdraw. "We had to pick our way across country to get out of the town without being seen by the enemy" East Sussex News 16.10.14.

29th November 1914

King George V sails from Newhaven

29th November 1914. King George V set sail from Newhaven on board the s.s. "Brighton IV" for his first visit to the troops on the Western Front.

At the outbreak of war the s.s. "Brighton IV" was fitted out as a troop ship, before later being converted to a hospital ship. Captain James Ellis, master of the "Brighton IV", was presented with a gold tie pin from the King, as a souvenir of the occasion.





REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 9th NOVEMBER 2014

The annual service and parade for Remembrance Day takes place this year on Sunday 9th November. As usual there will be a service at St Michael's Church starting at 9.45am. This year, to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the outbreak of the First World War, school children will read the names of Newhaven casualties during the service.

Following the service, the parade will form up in Neill's Close, before marching down Meeching Rise, across and down the one-way into Meeching Road, down the High Street and finally along Bridge Street to the Memorial Green. At 11am there will be a two minute silence followed by prayers and wreath laying.

NEWHAVEN BECOMES A NO COLD CALLING ZONE

Thank you to everyone who took part in the consultation in the spring about making Newhaven a "No Cold Calling Zone". The response to the consultation was an overwhelming "yes" and so the town council has decided to go ahead and set up the zone in partnership with local police and Neighbourhood Watch groups.

You should have received with this edition of Newhaven Matters a handy sticker telling you what to do if uninvited salespeople turn up on your doorstep. You should keep this by your front door so that you will always know what to

The town council is arranging for signs to be put up at the boundaries of the town warning cold callers that they are not welcome here.

The "No Cold Calling Zone" will enable residents, particularly the more elderly, to turn away unwanted and intrusive doorstep callers and traders. This will reduce the number of distraction burglaries and enable the Police to identify cold callers and the locations they target in the town. Religious and political groups are exempt from the scheme.



Home-Start

Town Mayor, Councillor Judith Ost, has chosen Home-Start as the charity she will support during her year of office.

Home-Start has been based in the High Street since 1996. Since then they have supported over 1000 families in Newhaven and the local area.

Volunteers are the essential ingredient for their home-visiting service to be successful. They have all had parenting experience and so understand the difficulties faced by families with young children.

Volunteers attend an 8 day level 2 accredited training course before supporting a family. They are then matched with a family, who they visit approx eight times for two hours a week, supporting them towards an identified goal. Families need support for many reasons e.g. if they are feeling isolated or struggling with their toddler's behaviour. As volunteers only need to commit to up to eight visits, volunteering can fit around other commitments. If you have had

parenting experience and would like to join Home-Start's friendly team of volunteers, please do contact them.

Thanks to financial support from Newhaven Town Council, the Pop in and Play pre-school group at the Children's Centre on Denton Island can continue running from September. (1pm -2.30pm on Mondays, term time only.)

GOODBYE

The demolition of the Parker Pen factory and the planning application for housing to be built on the site marks the end of an era for Newhaven. The following brief history of Parker Pen uses information and pictures from the Our Newhaven website and Malcolm Troak's book "Pen to Paper".

During World War 1 an army transit camp consisting of a few huts was built in Railway Road. This camp played a major part in the transportation of men and materials across the channel to France.

After the war in 1921 Felix Macauley set up a fountain pen



factory called the Felix Works in the now redundant army camp. The factory survived some hard times during the depression in the late twenties and thirties and in 1930 the factory changed hands and became the Valentine Pen Company. The new owners

doubled the size of the factory unit and by 1934 100 people were employed on the site.

When World War 2 began the factory was assigned to manufacture firing pins and precision torpedo parts. Some pens were still being made but most of the machinery was converted to munitions work.

In 1945 the Parker Pen Company, which had started in Canada in 1888, bought the Valentine Pen factory, forming Parker Pen UK. The first pen to be made solely in Newhaven was the Parker Victory Pen. Many things begun during the War carried on, such as the employment of an errand boy to collect shopping from the town for employees, particularly women on shift work and also the twice daily broadcast of the BBC programme 'Music While you Work' through the factory tannoy system.

The dark blue uniforms the women are wearing were apparently very rough and uncomfortable and everyone was very pleased when they were eventually upgraded to new nylon ones.

There was lots of building work to extend the factory during the 1950s and 1960s and by the 1970s over 1,000 people were employed at the Newhaven Parker Pen factory. This could not continue in the modern age though and things became increasingly automated during the 1980s.

On Monday 10th October 1988 as part of the centenary celebrations of the Parker Pen Company, the Prime Minister, Margaret Thatcher visited the factory and met the staff.

The company's fortunes waxed and waned. By 1993, the Gillette Company had acquired Parker Pen. In 2000 Gillette sold their stationery division, including Parker Pen to Newell

Rubbermaid. In 2007 the Newhaven factory was scaled down, making nearly 200 people redundant, and it finally closed its doors in 2010.

Parker Pen 1955 My Memories

I left school at Fifteen and my first job was at the famous Parker Pen Factory. This picture is a scene just inside the "Feed" department, making the parts to go under the nib which feeds the ink to the nib for writing, hence the name. In the background were the rotating buffs for polishing different parts of pens, we were rewarded with a bonus of money depending on how fast we could turn out each amount of job lots.

I believe Tom Winton was in charge of us during this time.



WWI banners at Newhaven Museum

Newhaven Port proposals for new port facilities and job creation

Newhaven Port & Properties (NPP) is submitting a planning application to build a new, multipurpose, quayside of maximum length of 300 metres at the southern end of the port, which will also have the benefit of widening the current restricted access to the inner harbour and ferry terminal. The new quayside, if approved, will be used for the mooring and handling of a variety of vessels and cargoes and could potentially be a future replacement for the existing ferry terminal.

Associated with the new quayside, and part of the same planning application, NPP is proposing to clear and level some of the land behind it to provide a flat area for the management of cargoes and associated port activities. The maximum area that will be cleared is approximately 3 hectares. None of the proposed area is within, or adjacent to, the South Downs National Park or the Tide Mills archaeological site.

Provision of the new port facilities will hopefully bring another round of marine and renewable energy companies to Newhaven and – during the construction and operation of the new facilities – is estimated will generate a further 150 direct and indirect jobs.

NPP is running a Public Consultation on 14th October from 2-8pm at the Hillcrest Centre in Newhaven and encourages as many people as possible to attend to discuss the proposals.

GRANTS AVAILABLE FOR LOCAL ORGANISATIONS

Funding is now available from the town council's annual small grants scheme. Local voluntary organisations are invited to apply for funding for any project or scheme which will benefit Newhaven people. Typically sums awarded under the scheme range from about £50 to about £200.

WHAT NEXT FOR THE BAY VUE AMENITY AREA?

Work to collapse the air raid shelters beneath the Bay Vue Amenity Area in Bay Vue Road (next to the Hillcrest Community Centre) and make the site safe has unfortunately taken longer than expected and the town council's contractors have had to return to the site. It is hoped to re-open the area during the Autumn.

This small grassed area has always been kept very simple. Having gone to so much trouble to re-open it, the town council would now like to ask the local community what improvements they would like to see there.

"I would like to see the following at the Bay Vue Amenity Area..."

Some ideas put forward so far are:

- Put in a path to make the site accessible for wheelchairs and buggies
- Provide more seating
- Plant flowering shrubs
- Provide some small play equipment for younger children
- Or provide landscaped features for young children's play, rather than formal play equipment

We will be asking children in schools and nurseries close to the amenity area for their ideas. But what do adults think about it?







Newhaven FC 'The Dockers'

A local club with the community at its heart, Newhaven FC has progressed over recent years from park football to now competing in the top division of the Sussex County Football League. The club has progressed dramatically over the last 4 years both on and off the pitch and now supports two senior teams, three youth teams and a girls' team. The club works with Fitzroy, a local charity who support mentally and physically handicapped people, helping to bring them back into the community with local support. The club also supports IGO which is about encouraging disabled people into sport, many of whom can be seen at the club's ground in Fort Road on a Saturday.

Newhaven FC has been fortunate to receive the backing of a major sponsor - Trafalgar Group, a local company - and recently has been granted £100k investment from Veolia for the regeneration of the stand that was once started but never finished. The club continues to work with local businesses for sponsorship and support, to fulfil their aim of bringing football to the community and encouraging a spirit and sense of belonging that all the locals can be proud of.



Newhaven JFC 'Young Dockers'

Newhaven FC started their first boys' side last year with an Under13s team which entered the Sussex Sunday Youth League. After getting a sponsor for the kit the season got underway with over twenty boys wanting to play, a very healthy number. When the dark nights came in November they moved from Fort Road to Seaford for training under lights on the all-weather pitch at the Downs Leisure Centre, enabling the boys to keep playing during the long wet winter.

The season went well and the boys finished the season in 3rd place - a great effort for their first season. With so many boys still attending, the club decided to run two teams for the new season. The town council's sponsorship of £200.00 was gratefully received and later they also gained another sponsorship from the Soccer Foundation, enabling them to have two under 14 sides for the new season.

The building was closed for a number of weeks for essential repairs but is now fully reopened.

There is a daily drop in service between 11am and 2pm where anyone can go in and speak to a support worker.

There is plenty going on at Your Way: coffee and chat groups on Mondays and Fridays, a craft group on Wednesdays, Munchkins toddler group on Thursdays and a walking group on Fridays. They also run a project called Football Therapy that is run around the whole of the Lewes district with Lewes FC, this is a group where people with mental health issues can socialise with one another. 
