WEST BEACH

The report by the Inspector at the Public Inquiry into the town council's right of way application for West Beach was received at the beginning of September.

The result is a partial victory for the town council – the Inspector agrees that the full width of the promenade is a right of way, but does not accept that the steps down to the sandy beach should also be a right of way. Unfortunately of course local people would need to use the steps to gain access to the sand.

Michael Lowe, the Inspector, found that the promenade is similar in nature to a private road where the presumption is that the full width of the way has been dedicated and there is no indication that the public have been restricted to any particular part of the promenade. Mr Lowe also concludes that parking is permitted on the northern and southern edges of the promenade.

On the issue of the steps, however, Mr Lowe decided that use of the steps was purely ancillary to the use of the beach for recreational purposes, which the Supreme Court in the village green case decided was by permission of the landowner as a result of the bye-laws. For the public to be using either the beach or the steps "as of right" they would have to have been doing so without permission.

As the decision is to amend the Order proposed by East Sussex County Council (by deleting the steps) the modified Order will have to be advertised and there will then be an opportunity for comments to be made. The town council will be considering the report carefully with the advice of its legal team before deciding what comments to make.

In the meantime, a French version of the video made by the town council to show the feelings of local people about the closure of the beach was sent to the directors of NPP in Rouen during the summer. The town council still hopes to be able to meet them and talk to them face-to-face. A French journalist visited Newhaven at the end of August and he published a double page article on the closure of the beach in French newspaper Paris-Normande.





Newhaven Neighbourhood Plan



The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group continue to meet regularly and will soon be having conversations with the Highway Department on how the roads in Newhaven can be improved, given the need to allocate land in the town for new development.

We also hope to have classroom conversations with local school children and a drawing competition for the junior age, so they can express what they would like to see our town to look like.

The next Newhaven Matters will set out when we will be asking for your opinions on the draft Plan, which will amongst other things set out ideas on where new development can go, what it could look like and how much open space will be available.

Save the Union!

Newhaven's town councillors of all political persuasions are united in opposition to the plans recently announced by Lewes District Council to build houses on Meeching Down, also known as The Union.

Residents reacted with shock and anger to the announcement made by Lewes District Council in June that Meeching Down was one of the sites it intends to build on.

A public consultation event was organised by Lewes District Council at the Hillcrest Centre on 23rd July which was attended by a large number of very unhappy residents. At the meeting preliminary draft plans were unveiled showing 96 dwellings (a mix of flats and three bedroom houses) on the section of the site closest to Brighton Road.



Town and District Councillors Steve Saunders and Julie Carr handed a petition to Lewes District Council containing 1562 signatures on 16th July. As the petition contained more than 1500 signatures Lewes District Council will be forced to formally debate the petition. This is expected to take place at the meeting of Lewes District Council on 14th October. The meeting will be held at County Hall, Lewes starting at 2.30pm and will be open to the public.

The town council has applied for the site to be registered as an Asset of Community Value. If the application is accepted this would mean that before the District Council could sell the land to a developer the local community would be given six months to bid to purchase it instead. It does not, however, mean that the District Council would have to accept such a bid.

On August Bank Holiday Sunday, local residents organised a protest picnic at the Union. Protesters held up banners on the field facing the main Brighton road and enjoyed the beauty of the wildflowers and trees that

would be lost if the proposal goes ahead. Following on from this, local residents organised a well-attended meeting to discuss further action on 3rd September.

Lewes District Council will be holding a further public consultation event at the Hillcrest Centre on Wednesday 4th November from 4.30-7.30pm.

GRANTS AVAILABLE FOR LOCAL ORGANISATIONS

Community Transport for the Lewes Area (CTLA)

In the recent Lewes District Business Awards, CTLA were named as finalists in the Access All Areas and Social Enterprise categories, in recognition of their contribution to improving accessibility and supporting the community.

General Manager, Derek Barnett, understands that CTLA provides more than just a journey.

"Isolation, loneliness and lack of transport options are issues we try to overcome every day," says Derek. "We enable our service users to access essential daily living, medical services, local business centres, other amenities and recreational and social activities."

CTLA have a fleet of 19 accessible minibuses, with tail lifts or ramps, suitable for wheelchair users.

They provide Dial-a-Ride (door to door) transport, adult social care and school transport, weekend and rural scheduled bus services, travel clubs and group transport for other charities and social groups such as the Scouts and Seniors Forums.

Dial-a-Ride is available for anyone for whom public

transport is unsuitable, for transport to social events, shops, lunch clubs or day centres, doctors, hospital appointments, and other destinations.

The CTLA Travel Club runs days out to many local attractions, including National Trust properties, and the charity also offers costeffective bus hire to community groups.

CTLA, in partnership with the Havens CCG, is now offering free transport to clinics and GP surgeries for patients of Quayside Medical Practice and Chapel Street Surgery. Patients must be registered in order to request the health transport. Registration is free and can be completed over the phone. Scouting - how amazing!!!

Started by Robert Baden Powell in 1907 Scouting is now recognised in 216 countries & territories and has a membership of over 31 million people. Continually moving with the times scouting provides a range of exciting activities, challenges and experiences for young people, male and female from a beaver scout aged 6 to an explorer scout aged 14-18. Each section has their own range of badges for the young people to earn and is run by a dedicated team of volunteer leaders and helpers who have had a DBS check and completed their own programme training.

The 2nd Denton & South Heighton Scout Group is based in the heart of Denton village and has a thriving beaver colony (6-8 yrs), cub pack (8-10½ yrs) and scout troop (10-14 yrs). They have the honour of wearing a "Ralph Reader" name tape on their uniforms. Ralph Reader, who became famous especially for his gang shows, was originally a scout in this group.

As well as taking part in weekly activities some scouts from the group are currently part of Scoutex, an international scout exchange with scouts in Cambridge in Canada which has been running in Seahaven for over 30 years.

Marine Workshops now UTC

The new UTC on Railway Quay opened for students in September. To mark the buildings being brought back into use we look back at them in their heyday.


The lead photo shows the old Sheerlegs crane in use beside the Workshops.

The following two photos are from the Our Newhaven website.



This picture shows the interior of the marine workshops in the early 1900s.

The workshops were constructed in 1882 and until the early 1960s were used to repair both train and ship engines. The upper storey was partly rebuilt during the mid-1940s and the building was re-roofed in 1961.



This photo belongs to Mr A J Lander and shows men at work in the carpenters' workshop. It includes two members of the Lander family – second from the left is Mr William Baldwin Lander who was Foreman Shipwright until his retirement in 1926; 6th from the left at the back turned slightly to one side is his son, William Robert Lander (Bert), who was Foreman Shipwright from 1927 until 1960.

UTC@harbourside will eventually take 600 students aged between 14 and 19 who will study all sorts of subjects, but especially maths, science and engineering. They are expected to end up in a wide range of careers from medicine to welding. The college will specialise in Marine Engineering – a very appropriate re-use of these lovely historical buildings. Refurbishment of the Carpenters Workshop is complete: it is hoped that work on the Marine Workshops will be finished by January. In the meantime students will be housed in the Carpenters Workshop and some temporary buildings onsite.

The Poppy Trail

Over the next couple of months, interpretation panels will be appearing around the town as part of the Council's Heritage Lottery funded project 'Newhaven's First World War'.

During the First World War, Newhaven became one of the major supply ports to the Western Front. The number of soldiers at the Garrison increased to over 4,000, the Boys' School (Hillcrest Centre) was converted into a Military Hospital and a Seaplane Station was built on the beach between the East Pier and Tide Mills.

The interpretation panels, collectively known as 'The Poppy Trail', will tell stories about how the war affected Newhaven and the people who lived and worked here. Find out what it was like to be a 'Tommy' encamped on the downs overlooking the Fort, or the dangers faced by the young pilots of the seaplanes that patrolled the coast from Newhaven looking for U-boats. What role did the railways and ferries play during the war? How did the war impact on the daily lives of the people who lived here?

There will be 8 different, site specific, interpretation panels. Each one will be illustrated with photographs from local archives, such as those of Newhaven Museum, Newhaven Fort and private collections. Locations of the panels are shown on the map. Stories supporting the panels will also be included in a dedicated section of the Council's website. We will let you know when The Poppy Trail

interpretation panels have been installed though the local press, our website and the Council's Facebook page.






Denton's First World

NO COLD CALLING ZONE

Newhaven has been a No Cold Calling Zone since the beginning of the year, when the signs were erected at the town's boundaries.

The aim of the Zone is to enable residents, particularly the more elderly, to turn away unwanted and intrusive doorstep callers and traders. This will reduce the number of distraction burglaries and enable the Police to identify cold callers and the locations they target in the town. Religious and political groups are exempt from the scheme.

Friends of Riverside Park

Riverside Park is the huge area opposite the incinerator which includes Lewes Road Rec, the historic tip site and the wetland area to the north. The Community group 'Friends of Riverside Park' was formed in March 2014 by locals who value and appreciate the site as a green open space.

In December, East Sussex County Council confirmed that incinerator 'Section 106' money could be used to improve aspects of Riverside Park. Wildlife surveys were carried out in spring and work is expected to begin this Autumn to improve and protect the landscape and habitats of the site, create a circular walk with regular seating and bins and develop information panels about the park.

Ultimately, the Friends would like to see the rec raised / drained and developed as a multipurpose play area and a Community Hub with café and cycle hire linked to the Linklater Pavilion in Lewes by the Egrets Way.

Friends of Riverside Park meet every third Sunday of the month between 10am and 12pm for a litter pick on the site and anyone is welcome to come along to this and find out more. Christmas Gifts for Newhaven Servicemen

In November and December 1915, 'an appeal to the inhabitants of the district' was made by F J Thyer,



Chairman of Newhaven Urban District Council, to provide a Christmas gift to all Newhaven men serving in His Majesty's Forces. A total of £51. 9s. 6d. was collected. Each Newhaven man, serving afloat or abroad, was sent a parcel containing ½ lb of tobacco, 60 cigarettes and a briar pipe. Those on service at home received ¼ lb of tobacco and 50 cigarettes. Gifts were sent to 153 men afloat or abroad and 93 men on service at home.

Double Sessions at the Girls' School

At the outbreak of war, the Boys' School (Hillcrest Centre) was taken over by the Military and converted into a Military Hospital. The boys were initially taught in the Church Room, with four classes taught in one room, divided by curtains. Mr Hughes, one of the School Managers, exclaimed that "the Boys' School is the most important of all, and yet they have the worst building". In 1915, double sessions began at the Girls' School, with the school building being shared on a rota system. One week the boys were taught in the morning and the girls in the afternoon. The following week, the sessions would be swapped. However, this wasn't an end to the problems, as

Mr Colgate, one of the School Manager's commented "the girls and boys attend school half a day and are running the streets the other half and when the next day comes they have forgotten what they had been taught on the previous day".



REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY -8th NOVEMBER 2015

The annual service and parade for Remembrance Day takes place this year on Sunday 8th November, As usual there will be a service at St Michael's Church starting at 9.45am. As last year, to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the First World War, school children will read the names of Newhaven casualties who died in 1915 during the service and will lay crosses in their memory at the green.

Following the service, the parade will form up in Neill's Close, before marching down Meeching Rise, across and down the one-way into Meeching Road, down the High Street and finally along Bridge Street to the Memorial Green. At 11am there will be a two minute silence followed by prayers and wreath laying.
