The Responders have bought defibrillators and put money towards the purchase of a new emergency vehicle. The Lifeboats have purchased GoPro cameras to accurately record their operations



and are looking to purchase more hi tech monitoring equipment for their station.

We are now starting to organise this year's events to raise money for more defibrillators to site around our town. We have already presented one to The Ark and are looking to present further units to Paradise Park and the Lifeboat Station. A quiz and a tea dance are already planned, along with the annual carol concert at St. Michael's Church.

We have all enjoyed our glorious Fish Festival, Mencap Summer Fair and the Raft Race and Sharon and I have attended many events on behalf of the town. We had a great turn out for our Dieppe Raid Commemoration event in August and I was accompanied to Dieppe by my deputy June Dyer, for their events. June has attended a number of engagements for me including Nippers Fun Day, at which she took part in the mud slide. As a working Councillor, it is sometimes difficult to get to every event that I am invited to and I am very grateful for her support.

Hillcrest Amateur Boxing Club

Hillcrest ABC was born from the ashes of the closed Seaford ABC in 2005. A purpose built boxing gym was created in the derelict basement of the Hillcrest Centre, designed by ex-amateur champions and professional boxers George Danahar and Terry Parkinson. Since then the club has grown and evolved over the past eleven years to be a highly regarded boxing club across the entire South of England and as far north as the Midlands. The club fighters are regularly competing in county, regional and national competitions.

The club is fully licensed and part of the Amateur Boxing Association (ABA), the national governing body. A true community club, its members are involved in local charity fundraising and working with local charities and voluntary groups.

Groups at the club consist of:

- ABA seniors, mostly consisting of competing boxers and those that may wish to compete.
- ABA juniors, young people who like boxing training, who may compete if they wish.
- Female only sessions, for those who wish to compete and those just seeking a good level of fitness (female competitors also train within ABA seniors).
- Veterans and keep fit males, of all ages from 20 -70.

Whilst a very serious boxing club, and all groups training very hard, fun in the gym and club functions are a huge part of the Hillcrest ABC ethos, taught by serious minded coaches with a sense that sports should be fun. The Hillcrest is

a happy club open to all members to work and train.

OUR NEWHAVEN

More photos and memories of old Newhaven

DENTON

The Manor of Denton was held in Saxon times by Earl Godwin, father of King Harold. There is no mention of Denton in the Doomsday book of 1068 so it is probable that the original village was destroyed during the Saxon rebellion of that year.

St Leonard's church was

built around 1288 and was later extended and carefully restored during the Decorated Period. The walls are of flint and stone. The Vestry was added during the 20th Century and the remains of what is thought to have been a Priest's House dating from about 1280, have recently been partly restored.

FLYING FISH

Originally called the Kicking Donkey, the pub dates back to the 18th Century. Its current name probably comes from seaplanes using Newhaven Harbour during the first World War. It is probably the only pub with this name in the country.

DENTON MANOR HOUSE

The manor house was built in 1724, and was believed to have been a prosperous farmhouse of fourteen rooms. Owing to its proximity to the church it has been, on more than one occasion, the parish rectory.

During the war the manor was the headquarters of the 521 Coastal Regiment Royal Artillery which controlled all of the army artillery gun sites and observation posts along this part of the Sussex shoreline. It is believed that, prior to D-Day, many RA Coastal Regiments had their officers replaced with Canadian Officers under a scheme called 'CanLoan' to release the more-experienced British Officers to Field Artillery Units for D-Day. However, no evidence has yet been discovered to support this belief (probably because of the wartime secrecy).



RAIPH READER'S HOUSE

Ralph Reader who created the Gang Show for the Boy Scout movement was from Denton and lived in this house.

Newhaven Flood Alleviation Scheme moves into construction phase

The Environment Agency (EA) and partners are working together to build a scheme to reduce the risk of tidal flooding from the River Ouse. When complete, the scheme will protect over 800 homes and businesses and vital infrastructure within Newhaven.

In July 2016, planning permission was granted by Lewes District Council. Contractors carried out ground investigation works on the 'West Bank' in August for 2 weeks. This involved drilling boreholes and trial pits to check ground conditions.

Construction of the improved defences starts in November 2016 (subject to planning), which will be done in phases. The first phase will include works from the swing bridge to West Quay and from Riverside Park to the swing bridge.

The EA will continue to consult residents and businesses that will be directly affected by the construction work and update the local community about the project throughout the autumn.


VOLUNTEER ADVISERS

Guesthouse.



All proposals will be assessed by the trustees, and those shortlisted may be required to present their work to other Centre users before a commission would be confirmed.

HOW TO REPORT A HIGHWAYS FAULT

Did you know that East Sussex County Council has a new system for reporting problems online?

- 1. Visit www.
 eastsussexhighways.com
 and click 'Report a Problem'
 at the top of the screen.
- 2. You will be taken to the 'Knowledge' area. This area will provide you with information regarding the problem you want to report. You can use the search box or the menu on the right to choose the subject. For example, potholes.
- 3. Click on the topic that you think would best answer your question. If the article doesn't help and you need to report a pothole then click the purple report button. This will take you to the Highways map where you can search by road name or town.
- 4. Once selected, click on the area where there is an issue. Click the 'Log a report in this area' button. You will then be taken to a form where you can fill out your details, information on your report and upload any photos of the issue that you may have.

RUNAWAY HORSES

Just after midday on Wednesday 4th October 1916 a pair of horses pulling a large military transport wagon took fright in Church Hill. The wagon mounted the pavement, knocked down part of the wall by the Baptist Chapel and flattened two road signs at the junction with Brighton Road before one of the horses fell opposite the Conservative Club. The horse got back up

and both horses continued their mad rush down the High Street where they collided with a milk pram, spilling all the milk and overturning the wagon. Luckily the driver had managed to jump off the wagon and wasn't hurt.



SCHOOL CHILDREN RUNNING THE STREETS

Because the Boy's School (now the Hillcrest Centre) had been taken over as a Military hospital, Newhaven's boys had to share the girls' school, alternating mornings and afternoons. At the monthly meeting held on 4th October 1916, the School Manager Mr Corbett thought the time had come to review the situation. He complained about a lack of discipline which resulted

from girls and boys only attending school for half a day and running the streets the other half. When the next day came they had forgotten what they had been taught the previous day. Schoolboys were going about the town smoking cigarettes. Mr Corbett concluded that this should be brought to the attention of H.M. Inspector to see what he suggested.

GOVERNMENT STORES STOLEN AT NEWHAVEN

On 21st December 1916 Charles Richmond, a storekeeper employed by the Army at Newhaven was stopped on the bridge by Sergeant Braine, who noticed that his coat looked bulky. Hidden under his coat was a bag of tea and a piece of canvas. When his lodgings at 20 Denton Island were searched, 2lb 14oz of butter, 8 tins of Army rations, 25 packets of cigarettes, 7 cakes of tobacco, 5 pints of rum, 2lb 14oz of sugar and 50 candles were found.

Mr Richmond had replaced the tea in the store room with newspaper and pieces of wood. He pleaded guilty to stealing Government stores and was sentenced to two months hard labour.







Happy Christmas from Meeching Amateur Dramatics (MAD)

But you won't have to go that far, only to Meeching Hall, Fort Road, Newhaven, from Friday 25th to Sunday 27th November and the following week Thursday 1st to Saturday 3rd December 2016.

In festive mood, the Farndale ladies mount yet another assault on the classics for their stage version of A Christmas Carol. Enthusiasm their middle name, and with the virile support of stage-manager Gordon, cast present a dizzy array of characters from the Dickensian favourite (and a few which aren't), under the ever battling leadership of Thelma and Mrs Reece. Of course, no

Farndale evening would be quite complete without those wayward touches of ingenuity for which the ladies are so justly famed.

MAD's August production was a tense murder mystery called

"And Evermore Shall Be So" by Norman Robbins. Mention was made from most who saw it that it was the group's best production! Richard Honeyman said in his review, "the well casted production was acted to a high standard and amongst the best I have seen them do. Credit also to the backstage crew as well." This is heartening for MAD as they approach their 20th year in 2017 with 46 productions under their belt.





REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 13th NOVEMBER 2016

The annual service and parade for Remembrance Day takes place this year on Sunday 13th November. As usual there will be a service at St Michael's Church starting at 9.45am. As last year, to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the First World War, school children will

read the names of Newhaven casualties who died in 1916 during the service and will lay crosses in their memory at the green.

Following the service, the parade will form up in Neill's Close, before marching

down Meeching Rise, across and down the one-way into Meeching Road, down the High Street and finally along Bridge Street to the Memorial Green. At 11am there will be a two minute silence followed by prayers and wreath laying.

The Royal British Legion Newhaven Branch founded in 1921



The Branch currently meets at Newhaven Social Club in Bridge Street on the first Thursday of every month at 7.30/8pm. The social club is

a very pleasant venue and meetings are held in a quiet corner.

At various times of the year they hold stalls selling crafts, dvds, cds and bric-a-brac to raise funds - this year's Fish Festival was a particular success for them.

Friends of Riverside Park

Since introducing the group in Newhaven Matters last year a lot has happened on the park. Working in partnership with East Sussex County Council, Lewes District Council and the Town Council, a 5 year Management Plan has been put in place to continue with habitat improvements.

All improvements have been paid for from the Veolia Section 106 funds and Friends of Riverside Park have been working closely with the three Councils to ensure that any work on the park fits with their vision of "access for all" and makes it somewhere that will be a real health asset to the town; a place to walk, run, cycle and improve mental wellbeing.

In the spring the contractors constructed a bird hide on the north east corner which overlooks the marsh area together with an owl box. Friends of Riverside Park will be seeking advice from wildlife groups to see what improvements can easily be made to attract more wildlife.

Five seats have been dotted around the park to enable users to rest and take in the natural surroundings and views of the Downs. It is hoped in future there will be funds to provide more seating, picnic benches and litter bins. Regular litter picking sessions help to keep the park clean but everyone can help by binning their own rubbish and clearing up after their dogs.

The circular path will mean that everyone in the community and beyond will be able to access the whole park throughout the year.
