STREET ADVERTISING

You can't just put a poster or banner up advertising something wherever you want. There are strict laws governing where signs and notices can be displayed and where they cannot.

The banners and posters that often appear attached to railings on Newhaven's one



way system are not allowed there. Banners and posters placed there are distracting for drivers and potentially dangerous. This means that even if you applied for planning permission to put an advertisement on the railings you would not be given it. The Highways Authority (East Sussex County Council) may remove advertising material put up in this way.

To advertise in the street in other less dangerous places you may need planning permission. You can download a guide giving full details of what is and isn't allowed from the Lewes District Council website: www.lewes.gov.uk/Files/plan guide for advertisers.pdf



Local residents have been telling us how much they miss the lovely display of cowslips there used to be at Newhaven Cemetery. In years gone by they made a bright and colourful Spring display, but when the town council contracted out its grounds maintenance operation some years ago, we forgot to ask our new contractors to leave the grass uncut during the Spring where the cowslips were and unfortunately. they got mown and lost.

So, this Spring the town council's grounds maintenance contractor Burleys has planted 1,500 cowslip plugs along the bank at the top of the Cemetery between the allotments and the Cemetery itself – a total area of 150sqm. Tide Mills

Most of us are familiar with the derelict village of Tide Mills which was abandoned in 1939, but how many of us know about its origins?

The mill was erected in 1761 by the Duke of Newcastle and was later owned and operated by William Catt and his family. The village consisted of a large tide mill and several cottages housing around 100 workers. The tide mill was operated by water from the rising tide turning water wheels and filling the pond behind; as the tide later drops, the water in the pond flows out and turns the wheels the other way. Originally the grain and flour were transported backwards and forwards in barges via the creek and its entrance into Newhaven harbour. When the creek was closed to improve the quays a spur line from Bishopstone station

was put in so the grain and flour could be transported by train, Tide Mills having its own station. Production stopped in the late 19th century and all that can be seen now are the foundations of a once flourishing village.

Newhaven Flood Alleviation Scheme underway



The scheme is being designed and constructed in phases and Environment Agency contractors are now nearing the end of the first phase.

In Huggett's Green a low level grass embankment at the rear of the Green has been realigned and raised to meet flood protection standards. Access has been maintained from West Quay Car Park and Fort Road through a new set of steps. Now the embankment

has been built the Green will be restored with seeding and tree planting.

Another 150m embankment has been constructed to the north of Riverside Park. Some tree removal was required but new trees were planted within the Park. The existing sites on the west bank will be tidied and cleared and work on the east bank is scheduled to begin in late spring.

Rampion Offshore Wind has kindly donated a tourist type telescope to the people of Newhaven to enable local residents and tourists to view the wind turbines being installed and the vessels that will be servicing and carrying out maintenance for the windfarm in future years.

Holiday frauds are on the increase and holidaymakers are being scammed out of millions of pounds by fraudsters.

Scammers are targeting online holiday booking and accommodation sites to scam unsuspecting customers into

paying for accommodation that is not available or does not even exist. Often the victim only realises they have been scammed when they arrive at their accommodation or holiday destination and find no booking has been made.

- Scammers often ask for payment by direct bank transfer away from the website. Where possible pay by credit card or through a reputable website's own payment system.
- Scammers often use photos of accommodation taken from other sites on the web. Check photos with a reverse image search engine to see where else the photos have been used.
- Try to research the property and see if it has its own website.
- Try to telephone the owner to confirm they are aware of the booking.
- If an advert claims they belong to a trade body such as ABTA contact the body to check.

Newhaven Fort reopens for business


Newhaven Fort opened its big old doors again in time for February half term holiday. The season kicked off with a week of All New Spy Camp, during which some junior special agents were introduced to some very interesting characters and had lots of fun trying to track down a sneaky sheep rustler!

Many Valley residents will remember the days when Valley Ponds were quite literally crawling with toads. The Ponds are a valuable breeding site for the Common Toad – which sadly is becoming much less common. Numbers of toads have been plummeting since the 1980s, not only at Valley Ponds, but also across the whole country and particularly in the South East.

The reasons for this are complicated, but may include climate change, pollution, loss of habitat and road traffic casualties as toads cross roads to get to their breeding ponds.

A toad crossing patrol has operated at the Ponds since the late 1970s, when it was started by local resident Janet Claydon. Over the years many dozens of local residents and their children have helped, collecting the toads and frogs

in buckets to prevent them being run over. They are then placed in the breeding pond to spawn. Toads and frogs tend to set out in search of a mate on the wettest nights of early Spring. They only do so when weather conditions are just how they like them, which can happen anytime between January and April, although February and March are the busiest times.

Toads have very bad road sense as they like to sit on black tarmac which has absorbed the sun's rays during the day and remains warm.

Males lie in ambush for females and will often couple up before they reach the ponds.

Sadly, despite the efforts of the stalwart volunteers of the toad crossing patrol, the

numbers of toads at Valley Ponds have plummeted to near extinction level.

This winter the town council commissioned a specialist audit report of the Ponds looking both at ways in which the toads could be helped and also at surface water flooding. As a result of the audit, we will be talking to the Highways Authority about making adjustments to gullies around the Ponds so that toads don't get trapped in them and looking at the creation of a small wetland area to try and filter pollution out of surface flooding before

it reaches the ponds.

NEWHAVEN'S FIRST WORLD WAR

Daylight Saving

- a problem for Newhaven schools




Class II, Newhaven Girls' School c.1912

British Summer Time was first adopted on 21st May 1916 to save fuel and money during war-time.

It was not popular with Miss Scanes, the headmistress of Newhaven Girls' School. In 1917, she complained that 'children were kept up late at night and in the morning were too tired to get up and

go to school in time, or, if they did attend, many were not fit for work'. A similar situation was reported at both Infants' schools when the matter was discussed at the School Managers (Governors) meeting on 6th June 1917. The chairman reported that children could often be seen 'running about the street at 10:30pm or later'.



Theft of Government stores

- a case from Newhaven

On 24th May 1917, P C William Standing, of the Railway Police, stopped and searched seaman George Beal and found his bag contained a tin of marmalade (value 6d.), 4lbs of rolled oats and 2lbs of flour (value 2s.). It appears the rolled oats and flour were taken from the ship's stores, but Mr Beal said he had picked up the tin of marmalade, which was government stores, from the deck. He was found guilty and fined £1 and told to be very careful of his conduct in future.

Enforcing food control in the Newhaven area

At a meeting of Newhaven Rural District Council on 1st June 1917, members discussed the Food Control Orders brought in by the government. Before the war roughly 80% of the UK's wheat and almost all of its sugar came from abroad. By 1917 food prices had increased on average by 93% and submarine warfare was hitting imports hard.

Among other things, the Food Control Orders stated that people were no longer allowed to use sugar and chocolate to decorate cakes. Limits were imposed on the price of essentials such as milk. bread and potatoes and there were restrictions on eating out. The job of enforcing the orders in the Newhaven area, was given to the local Sanitary Inspector.

Did you know that a third of all waste in an average household bin is food? By recycling food waste you reduce the amount incinerated which is much kinder to the environment.

- No amount of food is too small to recycle. You could start with just used tea bags and coffee granules. You can put any raw or cooked food into your caddy even uneaten food straight from your plate. If you compost your food waste you can still put dairy, meat bones, fish and cooked food into your food bin.
- To keep your food caddy clean regularly empty it into your outside food bin and use a compostable liner.

 Caddy liners are inexpensive and can be bought from many local shops, supermarkets and from the town council. Alternatively you can line your caddy with newspaper.
- After the district council collect your food waste they take it to be recycled into compost locally which is then used by farmers and gardeners in the area.

Newhaven Enterprise Zone set to begin

From this April, Newhaven will officially become an Enterprise Zone.

The Enterprise Zone (EZ) is composed of eight sites throughout the town, including the town centre, the port and Avis Way. Developments taking place on these sites will be eligible for significant benefits such as a business rates discount.

The EZ aims to facilitate the regeneration of the town over the next twenty-five years. Successful development on key Enterprise Zone sites should lead to new investment across the town leading to increased opportunities for all local residents. The EZ also enables additional reinvestment in Newhaven to enhance the town as a place to live, work and do business, although this will be through investment over the next 25 years.

A brighter approach to Newhaven Town station

A drab, neglected strip of land between the port lorry park and Newhaven Town railway station approach has been cleared of rubble, litter and overgrown bushes. The area is visible to train passengers and anyone using the railway station and ferry terminal. Passengers walking in and out of the station are already commenting positively on

the improvement. Burley's will maintain the grassed area as a community contribution.
