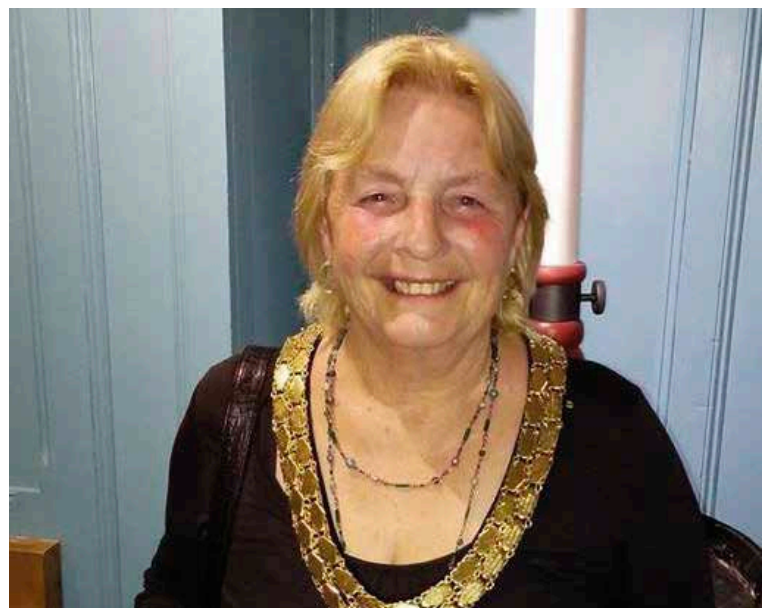

DEFIBRILLATORS FOR NEWHAVEN

Last year's Town Mayor, Councillor Steve Saunders raised over £6,600 through tea dances, quizzes and a Gala Dinner to enable him to purchase five defibrillators to be installed in sites across Newhaven to help save lives.

The defibrillators have been presented to Sainsburys, Paradise Park, the Hillcrest Community Centre, the

Newhaven Lifeboat Station and Newhaven Fort.

A defibrillator is a device that gives a high energy electric shock to the heart through the chest wall to someone who is in cardiac arrest. The ones in Newhaven are public access defibrillators and are in public locations where lots of people gather so that anyone can use them in an emergency. The

machine gives clear spoken instructions and you don't need training to use one. The defibrillator detects the heart's rhythm and it won't deliver a shock unless one is needed.

SCHOOL CROSSING PATROL SAVED BY TOWN COUNCIL

Newhaven Town Council has agreed to fully fund the Denton School Crossing Patrol for the forthcoming academic year, September 2017 to July 2018.

The crossing patrol is manned by Maureen Hood, seen here helping local children to cross the road. Up until 2014, the patrol was directly paid for by East Sussex County Council. However, funding was then withdrawn following the adoption of a new policy which meant that only patrols meeting specific criteria would continue to be paid for.

Veolia kindly agreed to fund the patrol for two years (2014-

15 and 2015-16) and for the past year the patrol has been part funded by the town council and part funded by the school itself.

However, further cuts to school funding have meant that the school can no longer afford to contribute. The school has set up a crowdfunding page on justgiving.com, which has raised £555 so far (the total cost for the patrol is £3,750 per year). The Town Council hopes that it may be possible for the school to raise enough money for the patrol to continue from September 2018 through this and other means.





NEWHAVEN'S YOUNG HEROES RECEIVE AWARDS

The 2017 Newhaven Community Awards for Young People were presented on Tuesday 2nd May at a ceremony at the Hillcrest Community Centre.

The winner of the Young Achiever Award was George Taylor. George volunteered at Newhaven Fort for two years and helped out with events held by Art Techniques at Easter and Halloween as well as with a special project for the 100th anniversary of World War 1. He is now producing short videos, taking photos and assisting with many of the community events in the town. George was presented with his award by Mike Shorer of the Newhaven Chamber of Commerce, who sponsored this award.

The winner of the Young Sportsperson Award was Katie Eagle. Katie is the only girl in the Newhaven Cricket Club under 12 team and also

the only girl in Seahaven Academy's team. She was the captain of the Sussex girls under 12 team last year and will be playing for Sussex again this year. Katie was presented with her award by Paul Daniels of the James Daniels Memorial Fund, which sponsored this award.

The winner of the Young Carer Award was Shamara Holt, who with the help of her sister cares for her Dad who is battling cancer. Sadly, Shamara was unable to attend the ceremony as her father had been rushed into hospital. Her award was collected for her by Katie Hartfield and was presented by Liz Allsobrook of Wave Leisure, who sponsored this award.

Seb Zuddas was chosen from all the nominees for all the awards to receive the overall Newhaven Community Award for Young People 2017. Seb is a student at UTC@harbourside and was the first to volunteer when the school was challenged to build something from nothing, working together as a single team, identifying initiatives and delivering them – with zero funding and little resources. He has got eleven other students on board with him and now has three projects on the go and is delivering them all. Seb was presented with his award by Simon Smyth of Computer-Eyez, who sponsored this award.

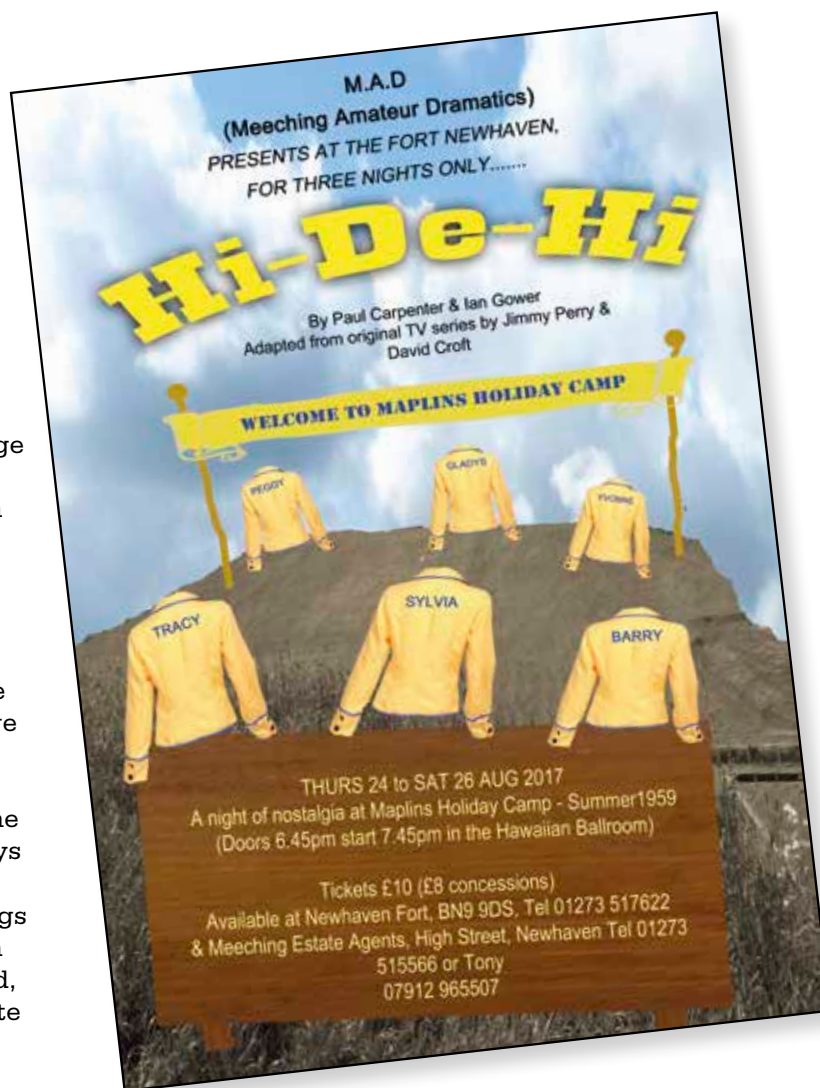

Denton Island

Denton Island is an artificial island created by the straightening of the river Ouse in the 1860s. It is named after the land on the opposite side of the river to Newhaven town, which is in the parish of Denton. The first bridge built across the Ouse was a wooden cantilever construction and a toll was charged to those who wished to cross. This bridge was replaced by a brick bridge and then by the current bridge in 1983.

Cottages were built on the island during the 1800's and the Denton islanders became a community in their own right. This picture, taken in the 1930's, shows the houses of Sefton Terrace with Catts Cottages leading away to the left.

The cottages were demolished in the 1940's/50's and were replaced by a small

engineering firm and later Fergusons, who manufactured stereo systems. The island has since been redeveloped and is now home to a boat yard, indoor bowling centre, college, business centre and several businesses.

NEWHAVEN'S NEW TREE WARDENS

Following the article in the winter edition of Newhaven Matters a small group of keen volunteers has been meeting with town councillors to discuss how they can help to make a real difference to the quality of our environment by becoming Tree Wardens for Newhaven.

The group wants to plant trees, shrubs and wildflowers in public areas where they can be seen and enjoyed by local

people and to raise awareness in the town of the value and benefits of trees and shrubs and their preservation and protection.

A list of possible sites for planting schemes is being drawn up and investigations carried out to find out who owns the land involved. The group hopes to be able to carry out its first project in the Autumn/Winter period.

SAD LOSS OF A MUCH LOVED TREE

Local residents and town councillors have been very sad to see the Huntingdon Elm tree on the former Grays School site cut down in May.

This once magnificent tree was at one time said to be the largest of its kind in Sussex, although it had been much reduced in size in the year 2000 because of fears that heavy

branches might fall on nearby classrooms.

The tree had already been found to be diseased – it was infected with parasitic fungi which were making the wood decay – when winds in March brought a large part of the tree down. Lewes District Council's Tree and Landscape Officer visited the site soon after

this collapse to see whether it might be possible to save any part of the tree. Sadly, his professional opinion was that the scale of the decay and extent of damage was too great and so the decision was made to exempt the tree from the Tree Preservation Order and allow the landowners to remove the tree.

WHO SHOULD YOU CALL IF YOU FIND AN INJURED SEAGULL OR POORLY FOX?

East Sussex Wildlife Rescue & Ambulance Service (WRAS) is a charity with its own Casualty Care Centre on the A22 between Hailsham and Uckfield which can take in



around 200 wildlife casualties at any one time. Additionally it works with 11 different veterinary practices, using special veterinary ambulances to transport casualties and has a number of sites across the county where it can rehabilitate casualties outside before releasing them.

The ambulances have been involved in numerous rescues including helping to deal with a seal trapped in a nuclear power station, an albino deer with its antlers caught in a rope swing, a badger stuck in a disused swimming pool, a fox trapped in a drain, a bird caught in chimney, birds flying round inside a house, run over hedgehogs and much more.

Beat the Street

Hundreds of people are expected to take to the streets across Newhaven from June as the town is transformed into a giant walking and cycling game.



Running from 7th June to 26th July, Beat the Street is a free, fun challenge which will turn East Sussex into a massive game where people are rewarded with points and prizes for exploring their local area on foot or by bicycle. You can join in and start at any point between those dates.

More than 400 special sensors called 'Beat Boxes' will appear across the county. Players in Newhaven can pick up their own Beat the Street card and map at Newhaven library and swipe as many Beat Boxes as possible to receive points and win prizes.

Teams across East Sussex will be competing against each other to see who can travel the furthest and win thousands of pounds' worth of prizes. Players can create their own

teams with their friends or colleagues or register to join an existing team or school to be in with a chance to win big prizes which will be announced in the next few weeks.

NEWHAVEN'S FIRST WORLD WAR



A War Shrine at Newhaven

On 3rd August 1917, a War Shrine draped with the Union Jack was unveiled at Mr Richardson's bakery in Railway Road, East Side. Paid for by local residents, it listed 95 men from East Side (almost 20% of the population), who were serving their country. Before the unveiling a service was held at East Side Mission Hall, which particularly remembered eight of those East Side men who had died during the war.

Following the unveiling the children of Railway Road Infants School sang 'Keep the home fires burning'.



Air Raid Precautions at Schools

In July 1917, the managers of Newhaven's 4 schools considered what to do in the event of an air raid. None of the schools had basements, so the choice was to keep children in school until the danger had passed or send them home. They considered keeping the children in school and giving them singing lessons to take their mind off the raid. However, the decision was made to send the children home, Mr Colgate saying "It would be a terrible thing if a bomb, or possibly two, were to be dropped on their school with 400 children in it".

Theft of Government Sugar at Newhaven

By 1917, food shortages were beginning to hit the home front, with sugar being particularly scarce. Newhaven was one of the major supply ports to the Western Front, and many of the men working at the Port were tempted by the food being transported. On 24th August 1917, Lewes Police Court heard the case of a port worker found hiding a bag of sugar under a bench

at London Road Station. The 3 ½ lb bag of sugar had been hidden in the sleeve of his overcoat, which had been tied at one end. At Court he pleaded guilty and was sentenced to 14 days' hard labour.

LOCAL HISTORY *on your doorstep!*

Newhaven Museum allows you to explore and find information using both private and public collections. The Newhaven Historical Society members volunteer their time to staff the museum, happy to share their knowledge of the collections and Newhaven's history.

Major changes have been made during the past winter months. In order to protect the museum's photographic collection from further deterioration, it has been housed in a purpose built and controlled environment room. Visitors are now able to use a new computer system to search for any of the

20,000 photographs. If you're interested in a particular street or building in Newhaven, you can type in the location, and within a second or two you will see what photographs they have. Family historians can find out if there's any information about their predecessors and you can also be supplied with prints for a small fee.

While all this has been taking place, the museum volunteers have also been busy constructing new displays about Newhaven's fascinating history, including the harbour and maritime industry.

Why not call and see what a great museum is right on your doorstep – it's situated at Paradise Park in Avis Road, Newhaven, BN9 0DH. It's the last building on the right side of the entrance.

YOUR CHANCE TO INFLUENCE WHAT HAPPENS IN NEWHAVEN

Newhaven Town Council wants your views on the Neighbourhood Plan it has prepared. The plan identifies land for new retail outlets, commercial properties and 425 new homes which are in addition to the circa 900 homes already coming to Newhaven.

This is **your opportunity** to comment on where some of the homes will go and to give us your ideas on ways the town can be improved for the benefit of all residents.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Lewes District Council and an examiner will ensure that the Plan has followed the correct legal process, then will send eligible residents a polling card to vote 'YES' or 'NO' at a polling station on whether the plan should be adopted.

A failure to gain a majority vote of 'YES', will mean that Lewes District Council decide where the new homes go and what improvements will be made to the town.

You can respond to the Plan by using the COMMENTS FORM opposite which is also available on the Town Council's webpage above. The form sets out how you can submit your comments.

The deadline for the submission of forms has been extended to **5pm on 21st July 2017** to ensure that all residents get to hear about this important document which will impact on how Newhaven grows and develops.

Reducing flood risk to Newhaven

Protection for 900 homes, businesses and vital infrastructure

Environment Agency contractors JacksonHyder continue to make good progress:

- A 150m long embankment south of Riverside Park is finished. The area has been seeded with wildflowers and new trees planted.
- A 140m long reinforced concrete wall has been built south of the Swing Bridge

and a flood fence erected in West Quay.

- In Huggett's Green, an existing low level grass embankment has been raised to meet flood protection standards. The Green has been restored with seeding and tree planting. A new flood gate has been installed at the north end of the footpath.

Still to come:

- Flood walls will be built along the edge of the footpath either side of Denton Island bridge totaling 120m. Discovery of an unexpected concrete beam meant the defence had to be redesigned. The current pavement surface is temporary, while designs are finalised.
- Works on the east bank have started and include new defences and a flood gate across the railway line. Work here presents many challenges particularly working on commercial land occupied by businesses, a working port and a railway line.

COMMEMORATION *OF THE DIEPPE RAID*

This year sees the 75th anniversary of the ill-fated Dieppe Raid of 1942. The anniversary will be commemorated in Newhaven on Sunday 13th August with a wreath laying ceremony at the War Memorial Green in South Way. Wreaths will be laid by representatives from the Canadian High Commission, Dieppe City Council and the US Embassy, as well as by the Mayor of Newhaven and veterans' associations. The ceremony starts at 3pm and will be preceded by a parade from Denton Island to the Green.

There are hardly any men left now who took part in the fateful raid on 18th-19th August 1942, and this year will sadly be the last attended by the Canadian Veterans Association of the UK, which will disband in November.

Operation Jubilee, as it was codenamed, was a full frontal assault on the heavily defended port of Dieppe and was meant to be a good opportunity to test out techniques and equipment. Six thousand soldiers took part in the attack, of whom 5,000 were Canadian with the remainder being British commandos and 50 American rangers. On

the warm, moonless night of 18th August 1942 an armada of ships took the troops across the Channel from Newhaven, Shoreham, Portsmouth and Southampton.

Within a few hours of the start of the assault, 4000 of the men were either killed, wounded or taken prisoner. The Canadians lost two thirds of their force, with 907 dead or later to die from their wounds. The operation was a tactical and human disaster. Was this a terrible, pointless waste of young lives, or a valuable lesson learnt which meant that fewer lives were lost on D-day two years later?

NEWHAVEN COMMUNITY GARDEN

Members of Newhaven's Community Garden recently played host to fifteen cyclists at the gardens on the clifftops above Newhaven. The cyclists had completed day two of their ride from London to Athens by cycling sixty miles from Shoreham in Kent. This is the second such ride in two years, the aim of which is to raise £100,000 for Khora, an organisation which runs a community centre in Athens working with refugees. An advance guard in the support vehicle set up all the tents

before the arrival of riders at 7.00pm. The riders were given a stirring reception by local artist Cliff Wright playing his bagpipes which together with a barbecue, a bonfire and lanterns all contributed to a memorable evening. Members of the Seaford Community Garden were also there to give their support.
