ESCAPE ROOM LAUNCHES AT NEWHAVEN FORT

In a first for the town. Newhaven Fort's brand-new escape room has launched, delighting visitors with an immersive story-driven experience set in the heart of the historic site.

Launched in April as part of the Fort's £7.5 million restoration, the escape room is one of several exciting upgrades alongside a new adventure playground and updated interactive exhibitions.

Designed by award-winning Brighton escape room specialists Pier Pressure, The Lucky Escape transports players back to 1979, where they work together to find a missing briefcase full of cash linked to a well-known gambler who has mysteriously disappeared. With the last ferry about to leave, teams follow clues and retrace his final steps before time runs out.

While the storyline takes inspiration from the infamous disappearance of Lord Lucan - whose car was abandoned in Newhaven in the 1970s -

the game weaves a fictional narrative that draws on a range of stories from Sussex's past including a nod to ABBA's famous 1974 Eurovision victory in Brighton.

Lindsay Lawrence, General Manager of Newhaven Fort,

"We're absolutely delighted with the response to the escape room. It's not only brought a whole new dimension to Newhaven Fort but it's been a fantastic addition for the town as a whole. Whether you're a seasoned escape room enthusiast or giving it a go for the first time, it's a brilliant way to connect with history in a fun, challenging and memorable wav."





The game, located in the Grand Magazine – a historic area once used to store gunpowder – is wheelchair accessible, featuring stepfree access.

Recommended for adults and children aged 8 and above (or 16+ when unaccompanied), groups of three to eight players can take part at a time, with each game lasting one hour. Sessions run four times daily from Sunday to Thursday with additional evening slots on Fridays and Saturdays. Tickets must be booked online in advance.

Newhaven Fort welcomes royal visit to commemorate £7.5m restoration

His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester visited Newhaven Fort in March to unveil a commemorative plaque celebrating the completion of its £7.5 million restoration.

During his visit, The Duke was given a guided tour highlighting key restoration efforts, including the Fort's brand-new adventure playground, restored casemates and enhanced exhibitions.

The Duke, who is a keen architect and Patron of the Fortress Study Group, also visited the newly-restored gun emplacements, which offer panoramic views across the Sussex coastline.

As NIPPERS enters its 52nd year of offering out-of-school activities, we have launched a new Lunch club for everyone in the community. The club takes place on Fridays during term time from 11am to 1pm. It is open to ages 0-99+ and is an opportunity for people to come and chat with their neighbours, play with their children and relax whilst having a cup of tea or coffee and enjoying some nibbles. The cost of the session is £1 per adult, and it would be great to see lots of people attending, across the age groups, to promote a sense of community.

NIPPERS is different to schoolbased after school clubs as staff have specialised qualifications based around play, including Playwork, Childcare and Forest School to enable us to offer a varied amount of activities on a daily basis. Adult to child ratios are smaller than schools. which means there are more staff to look after each child and their needs. Staff are also qualified in Pediatric First Aid, Safeguarding and Food Hygiene to ensure we meet Ofsted requirements, as all

after-school clubs not based in a school need to be registered and ensure staff have the relevant qualifications.

Children, aged 3-17, can enjoy all types of activities, arts, crafts, play, forest school, trips, picnics in the park, gardening in the community garden, a mud kitchen and just unwind after a long day in school.

Snacks and meals are offered at every session. Our main focus is letting children be children for as long as they can be, learning through play and a whole lot of fun.

We pride ourselves on offering reliable and consistent care for all our children that attend, and a variety of activities in a building that we have sole use of, during our opening times, 50-51 weeks of the year.

Currently we offer an After School Club, 3pm to 6pm term time. Children are collected by minibus or cars and brought to East Side Social Centre. This costs £10 per session.

Playschemes are run during every school holiday (except

the days between Christmas and New Year, so staff can be with their own children) from 7.30am to 6pm.

7.30am-8am £3; 8am-6pm £25; 8am-1pm or 1pm-6pm £15; 9am-4pm £21 per session.

The DfE/ESCC fund Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) playschemes, during the Summer and at Christmas; free places are available from 9am-3pm, 3 days a week, for those on benefit related free school meals or SEN.

Parents may be able to access up to 85% of their childcare costs through Tax Credits, which means a place at the after school club could cost parents as little as £1.50 for 3 hours of fun and knowing that their children will be fed.

ARTS SCENE BOOSTED WITH £100,000 FROM NEWHAVEN ENTERPRISE ZONE

Newhaven Enterprise Zone has provided £100,000 to help fund a programme of creative events in Newhaven which includes interactive art works from Leap Then Look at the Sidings in

August and September, and the Haven Young Creatives' Harbour Lights procession.

Newhaven Port and Properties' sustainability mission

At Newhaven Port and Properties, we are committed to sustainability. Recent examples of our commitment include installing solar panels. In 2020, we partnered with Brett Aggregates to re-open the Port's rail link, significantly reducing our environmental footprint. Rail freight cuts carbon emissions by 76% compared to road transport and each train eliminates the need for approximately 90 trucks on local roads.

That same year, we began working with local legend and friend of Newhaven Port, Gaz Winder. He helps us by clearing the river of detritus from his yellow kayak, as well as carrying out regular beach cleans.

Fast forward to 2025 and we've come a long way. As a Port, we rely on international shipping and heavy industries. We're trying to reduce our carbon footprint as quickly as possible, with a long-term ambition of becoming net zero.

Reducing carbon emissions

Since first measuring our carbon footprint in 2022, we've tracked progress annually. Running on a 100% renewable energy tariff and with solar panels on three buildings, our electricity emissions are effectively zero. We've reduced our carbon footprint by 20% in 2024 compared to 2023, mainly by switching vehicles to hydrogenated vegetable oil and replacing some diesel forklifts with electric models. In the future, we plan to move to an all-electric vehicle fleet charged by solar wherever possible. We want to get to net zero carbon emissions. It's become an essential for businesses because we can't let the next generation inherit a planet where climate change impacts their daily lives.

Newhaven Swing Bridge

Situated on the A259, the Newhaven Swing Bridge is the only crossing in Newhaven over the River Ouse.

The current Swing Bridge opened in 1974, replacing an older bridge slightly to the south of the current location.

As its name indicates, it is a bridge over the river that swings open to let large pleasure craft and cargo boats and ships through. Traffic is paused to allow the swing bridge to open. Rollers and motors to the side and underneath enable the bridge to open. If you are standing by the bridge when it's opening, you may find it surprising how quiet and smooth the whole operation is. The average time the road is closed for a swing bridge opening is 10 minutes.

The bridge is owned by East Sussex County Council, looked after by Balfour Beatty Living Places, and operated by the Newhaven Port Authority's Harbour Master on the request of vessels using the Port. Vessels are supposed to give advance notice to Newhaven Port Authority's Harbour

Master if they need to be let through but sometimes this may be at short notice. Bridge opening times can, therefore, usually only be posted on the day. The timings are shown on the display at the control tower. The control tower operates 24/7.

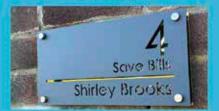

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The Twits is a Hit!

After watching Ignite's performance of The Twits by Roald Dahl at Meeching Hall, I wandered back up the hill leading to Harbour Heights, and I half expected to see, in the dark sky bespangled by constellations and planets, Mrs. Twit floating skyward under her helium star. Like all great children's stories, Dahl's story, The Twits, can be dissected for grander themes;

for example, greed, with Mr Twit's obsession with getting rich quick. Siou Hannam, the director, cleverly evoked the naïve innocence of Nature by using a troupe of children as dancing birds. Other great innovations by the director included the employment of a female narrator, functioning a little like one of Shakespeare's Jesters, commenting on the action and at times goading the audience into action with prompts. This was a really wonderful rendition of the

Twits. My only criticism might be that the supposed ugliness of Mrs Twit was betrayed by the perfect teeth of Lisa Fairfield who played her!

MOBILITY BIKE DAY

- The Big Park in Peacehaven

A fun day was had at The Big Park in April. The MoveAbility project, which is funded by the Motability Foundation and run in partnership by SCDA and Sustrans, brought several adapted bikes and e-bikes to the park, for local people to try out.

Jamie Lloyd from MoveAbility said, "The purpose of these days is to allow people who identify as having a disability the opportunity to try out our range of bikes in a safe environment and with trained staff on hand to assist if

needed. It was great to see the bikes being put to good use and everyone enjoyed themselves, despite the very warm weather."

Several people attended to try an e-bike for the first time to see first-hand how they can be transformative as a way of getting around. One local resident said; "It was a very worthwhile experience and I realised how convenient the bikes were for allowing me to exercise and at the same time get help for the hills. UNPAID CARERS IN EAST SUSSEX GET VITAL FUEL AND FINANCE GUIDANCE AS PART OF A £4M **SCHEME**

Unpaid Carers in East Sussex are being offered vital free support and guidance with their energy bills and finance. 'Care for the Carers, East Sussex' runs the Carer Money Matters service working in partnership with Sussex Community Development Association (SCDA); this service is available online, over the phone and face-to-face.

Carer Money Matters is being funded by all four of the UK's

Gas Distribution Networks and the national charity 'Carers Trust'. 'Care for the Carers, East Sussex' is one of the 23 local carer organisations, to offer this new service.

The service offers quidance on money matters for carers and their families, including support with managing and reducing debt, accessing grants and benefits and practical tips on keeping energy bills down.

Carer Money Matters can also help people get signed up to the Priority Service Register with their supplier. This allows them to access extra support with things like meter readings and carbon monoxide detectors.

The service will also help build carers financial resilience through:

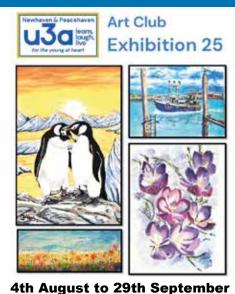

Volunteering with the National Coastwatch Institution in Newhaven

Up on the cliff to the west of Newhaven Fort, you may have seen the old Coastguard Hut - home since 2004 to the Newhaven station of the National Coastwatch Institution (NCI). Over 70 watchkeepers form the team who keep watch over the coast 365 days a year from 08:00 to 20:00 in the Summer, 17:00 in the Winter (or sunset if earlier). We act as 'eyes and ears' for the UK Coastguard: if we spot a problem we plot it and report it, and we respond to any issue that the Coastquard ask us to assist with. How did we get involved in NCI? We come from

a variety of backgrounds... many of us are retired but also a good number fit volunteering around jobs.

My story is that I picked up a leaflet in 2019. I'd retired from teaching in 2015 and was looking at volunteering opportunities. Having visited the Lookout, it took me about 30 seconds to decide that I wanted to be part of NCI and I shot an email off to the recruitment team. I sail, and I thought this could be an opportunity to use some of the skills I'd learned from that, and also I fell in love with the view! Not that any of our volunteers need any maritime experience... we provide a thorough training programme over several months to ensure everyone is equipped to take on watchkeeping with the right skills and with confidence. We need applicants to be at least 18 years old and

be mobile enough to get up our stairs! Volunteers are asked to do at least 3 watches per month (3 hour watches in the Winter, 4 hours in Summer).

I'm reminded on a daily basis that retirement is a blessing, as it gives you time to explore opportunities which you wouldn't normally come across... but I frequently have to ask myself – how did I ever have time to go to work??

which is a very visual depiction of the East Pier capturing what can be seen beneath, through and from its striking geometric structure. Tide and light, objects revealed and concealed, and sightings of the ferry. Look out for other works around the museum too."





THE MARINE WORKSHOPS

Have you ever wondered about the Marine Workshop building on the East Quay, its history and what it's used for now?

This important local landmark has a rich history! It is a Grade II listed building and was constructed in 1882 to house several engineering workshops, which were used to repair train and ship engines. Although the building was damaged during World War Two when a barge laden with munitions struck a mine outside the harbour, ship engines continued to be repaired there until the early 1960s. After being empty for a number of years, it then became a University Technical College (UTC), specialising in marine and environmental engineering, which closed in 2019. In 2023, Lewes District Council took over the building.

Today, the Marine Workshops is a buzzing hive of activity!

In addition to the space occupied by Lewes District Council, East Sussex College is situated on the first floor, offering technical and professional courses for local students. Independent, private companies are dotted around the building. On the ground floor, there is the fabulous Mamoosh Riverside deli, café and takeway, with additional outdoor seating along the river, overlooking the port.

There is a warm welcome for visitors in the reception area, where there is also a Tourist Information Centre (TIC), providing advice for local people and tourists alike. Tickets for local events are sold here, in addition to a wide range of lovely merchandise from local suppliers.

As well as all this, the Marine Workshops has a year-round programme of art and creativity run by Creative Newhaven. They have organised exhibitions and activities in the incredible BN9 studio on the top floor, which has stunning views to the Downs and the sea, and in the Atrium on the ground floor. They have also arranged entertainment and family-friendly activities at The

Sidings, located between the Marine Workshops and the Railway Club.

The entrance to the building is on the riverside (if you're lucky you may be able to spot oystercatchers, egrets, cormorants and the passing rowing gigs) and the car park is at the front of The Sidings, with two disabled spaces at the back of the building.

This aerial photo of a busy harbour scene is one of a series taken on 25th May 1931. From left to right, we can see Brighton IV at the Railway Quay, Dieppe in front of the large London & Paris Hotel, then Rouen in the East Quay's night berth near the Customs House and finally Worthing, which was only three years old at the time. The harbour tug Foremost 22 is at No.5 Stage near the old Lifeboat House and Harbour Watch House, and the bucket dredger Testside is at the lay-by berth

in Sleepers Hole. She would still be working at the port over 50 years later! Note that there is nothing but empty fields behind Eastside, with its distinctive gasholder.

- Listen to your body. Reduce intensity on extremely hot days. Dizziness or nausea? Stop and cool down immediately.

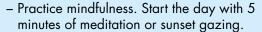
4. Protect Your Skin and Eyes

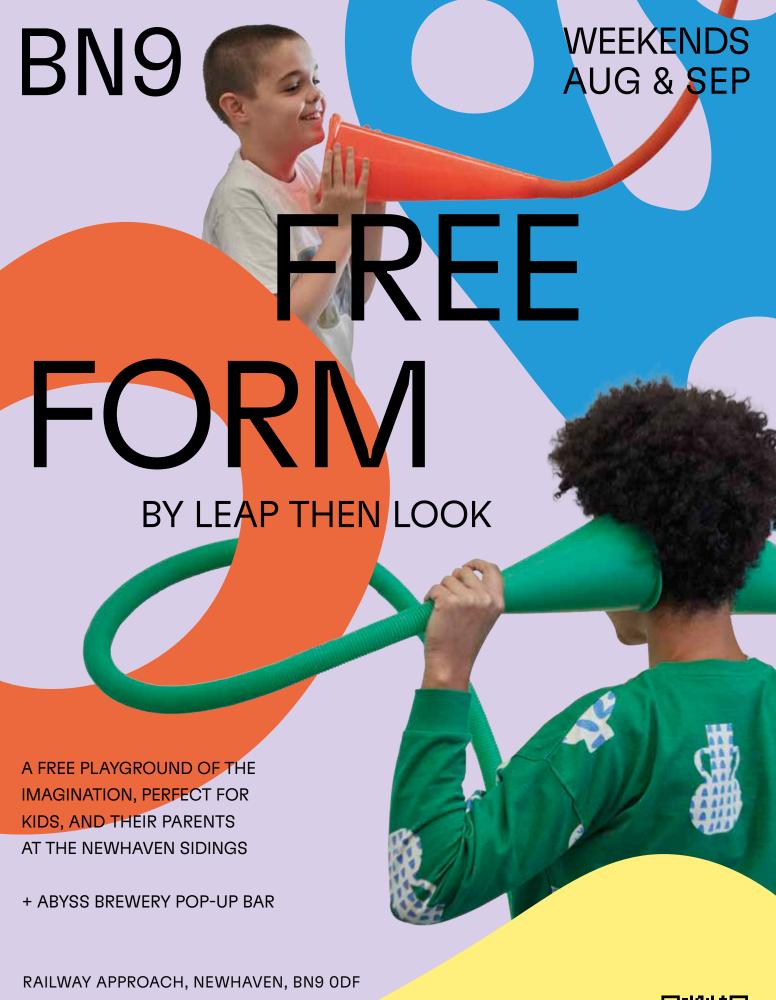
